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

Patrizio Antonazzo is the Chair of Unit of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Maurizio Bufalini Hospital Cesena. After Ob Gyn certification, he obtained a PhD in Sciences of prenatal growth, fetal diagnosis and therapy. Currently, Dr Antonazzo is chair of Birth Network of AUSL Romagna, head of local obstetrics network program and member of the Birth Commission of the Emilia Romagna Region.

His areas of expertise includes maternal and fetal health, management of high risk pregnancies, medical and surgical therapy of pelvic floor disorders, and education on technical and non-technical skills in labour complications and obstetric emergencies. In particular, Dr Antonazzo promotes the integration between risk management systems and delivery, with improved care in perinatal medicine.



Ilaria Fantasia has a doctorate in Fetal Medicine (MD, PhD) from the University of Trieste in collaboration with the King's College London in collaboration with the Fetal Medicine Foundation. She has a special interest in the field of prenatal diagnosis and maternal medicine and has collaborated in numerous research projects both nationally and internationally. Furthermore, she has published several scientific papers in indexed journals and has been involved in the drafting of national guidelines for the management of pregnancy complications, such as hypertension and intrauterine fetal death, as well as guidelines for ultrasound examination and prenatal screening (i.e. cell free DNA test). She is currently working at a San Salvatore University Hospital in L'Aquila where she is in charge of the Prenatal Diagnosis Unit and is responsible for the training of trainees and implementation of clinical practice in maternal-fetal medicine.



Alessandra Toscano is Director of Perinatal Cardiology at Bambino Gesù Children's Pediatric Hospital IRCCS, Rome, Italy, from 2018. Dr Alessandra Toscano received accreditation as physician from the University "La Sapienza" in Rome in 1995 and USMLE (United States Medical Licensing) in 1998. She obtained a PhD in Cardiovascular Physiology in 2000 at the University of Pisa-Modena and boards in Pediatrics and Cardiology at the University "La Sapienza" and University of "Tor-Vergata" in Rome, Italy. She did her fellowship in pediatric cardiology at Bambino Gesù Hospital in Rome. Her main current research is focused on Heart-Placenta-Brain axis, congenital heart phenotype and fetal predictors of complex congenital heart diseases. She is expert in non-invasive prenatal and postnatal diagnosis of complex congenital heart diseases and prenatal parental counseling. She also focuses on follow-up of cardiac diseases, functional echocardiography, advanced echocardiographic imaging in cardiac intensive care unit and cardiac operative room. She also deals with delivery room management of neonates with a prenatal diagnosis of congenital heart diseases.

ERICH SALING PERINATAL PRIZE



Jan Deprest is a leading international foetal surgeon, Head of Department and Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology who spent nearly his entire career and half of his professional time on translational research. He trained in foetal medicine in Leuven (Belgium), St George's Hospital London (UK), Leiden (Holland) and attended the programme at Children's Hospital Philadelphia (PA, USA). He established the Eurofoetus consortium, which is dedicated to the development of instruments and techniques for minimally invasive foetal and placental surgery.

The Leuven Foetal Medicine Team focuses on antenatal modulation of lung development, e.g. for pulmonary hypoplasia due to congenital diaphragmatic hernia (CDH) as well as for bronchopulmonary dysplasia. He has headed several clinical studies dedicated to the prenatal prediction of survival of foetuses with isolated CDH using genetic testing, ultrasound and foetal MRI imaging. He developed a percutaneous method for fetoscopic placement of a balloon into the foetal trachea (FETO). In a European task force together with the University of Barcelona (Hospital Clinic) and London (King's College Hospital) the team performed over 200 such procedures by 2009.

Tippi MacKenzie is Professor of Surgery at the UCSF Division of Pediatric Surgery and the Fetal Treatment Center. Dr. MacKenzie obtained her undergraduate degree in Biochemistry at Harvard, then came to the Bay Area for medical school at Stanford. She did her surgical residency at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston. During this time, she took three years to do research on fetal surgery and in utero stem cell transplantation at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.

Following residency, she returned to CHOP for her clinical pediatric surgery fellowship. Dr. MacKenzie's clinical interests include fetal surgery, advanced laparoscopy, and endocrine and biliary surgery. She has an active laboratory and is a member of the Biomedical Sciences Program and the Eli and Edythe Broad Center of Regeneration Medicine and Stem Cell Research. Her research focus is onmechanisms of tolerance induction following in utero stem cell transplantation and the pathophysiology of prenatally diagnosed diseases, such as congenital diaphragmatic hernia and gastroschisis, to identify biomarkers that predict prognosis and molecular pathways that may be targets for prenatal intervention.

Secluded in the heart of an elegant, peaceful part of central Milan, Villa Necchi Campiglio was designed in the early 1930s by the architect Piero Portaluppi at the behest of sisters Nedda and Gigina Necchi and Gigina's husband Angelo Campiglio, who embodied the cultured Lombard upper-middle class and were very much in synch with their time.

The building, nestling in an enchanted garden complete with tennis court and swimming pool

is characterised by generously proportioned, linear volumes; the splendour of the deco furnishings, the everyday items and the important artworks has been embellished of late by the bequest of the de' Micheli and Gian Ferrari collections, which contain works by such major names as Tiepolo, Canaletto, Sironi, De Chirico, Martini and Wildt. The Guido Sforni Collection (1935-1975) also includes pieces by 20th century masters such as Picasso, Fontana, Modigliani and Matisse, among others.

MONEY

As in the other EU nations, the **Euro** is Italy's currency. The Euro is divided into 100 cents.

Coin denominations are one, two, five, 10, 20 and 50 cents, $\in 1$ and $\in 2$. The notes are $\in 5$, $\in 10$, $\in 20$, $\notin 50$, $\notin 100$, $\notin 200$ and $\notin 500$.

Banks and building societies tend to offer the best exchange rates, and are plentiful: even small villages often have at least one. They mostly open from about 8.30 am to 3.30 pm Monday to Friday. Ask about commissions before changing (especially in exchange bureaux).

Tipping

The law requires menu prices to include a service charge; tipping is a matter of choice. Most people leave some small change if they're satisfied: 5% is normally fine and 10% generous. Porters will generally be happy with ! Taxi drivers don't have to be tipped.

Taxes & refunds

In Italy, value-added tax (VAT) is known as IVA.

On accommodation and restaurant prices, it is usually 10% and is often included in quoted prices. On retail goods and car hire, IVA is higher, normally 22%. Visitors are entitled to a refund of the 22% IVA on purchases from any shops if they are taking them.

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
